# Had

Read the following sentences.

**Had** is used in place of **has** or **have** when we talk about something that has already happened. We use **had** with *I, we, you, he, she, they* and with special names (e.g., Tina, Raj). We may use 'yesterday', 'last week', 'last month', 'last journey' with **had**.
