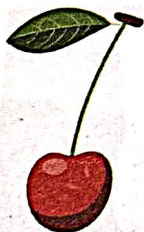

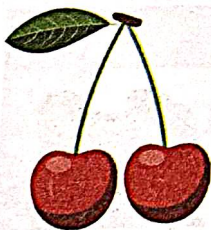
The nouns that end with 'y' are changed in the following manner-

Examples:



toy



toys



boy



boys

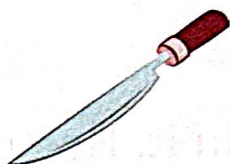

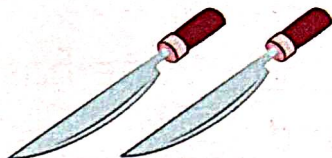
Learning Time

In case of nouns that end with 'f' or 'fe', we remove 'f' or 'fe' and add 'ves', at the end of the nouns.

Examples:



knife



knives



thief



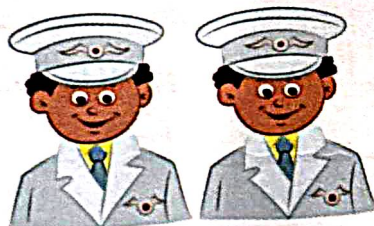
thieves

Examples:



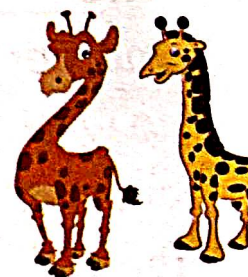
chief

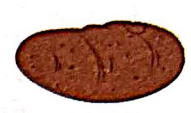

NOUNS — GENDERS

Some nouns tell us if a person or animal is a male or a female. These are called **genders**.

They are also divided into two categories.

A noun that refers to a male group is called **masculine gender**.

A noun that refers to a female group is called **feminine gender**.
