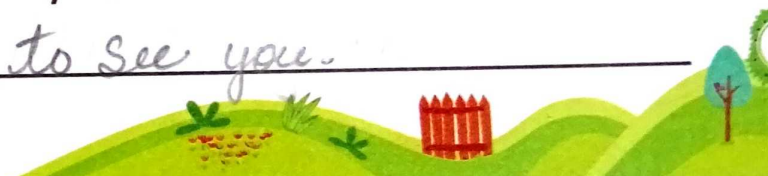

Learning Time

USES OF APOSTROPHE

We use 's' after the apostrophe to show belonging.

Examples:

1. The bag belongs to Mona.
This is Mona's bag.
2. The shoes belong to Rohan.
These are Rohan's shoes.



EXCEPTION

Nouns that end with 's' don't carry 's' after the apostrophe.

Examples:

1. All schools' cricket team are going for the tournament.
2. These boys' parents are invited for the party.

Examples:

1. My bag's zip needs to be repaired.
The above sentence is wrong, it should be written as:

The zip of my bag needs to be repaired. (Correct)

2. His shirt's colour is light. (Incorrect)



REMEMBER

We do not use apostrophe for non living things.
